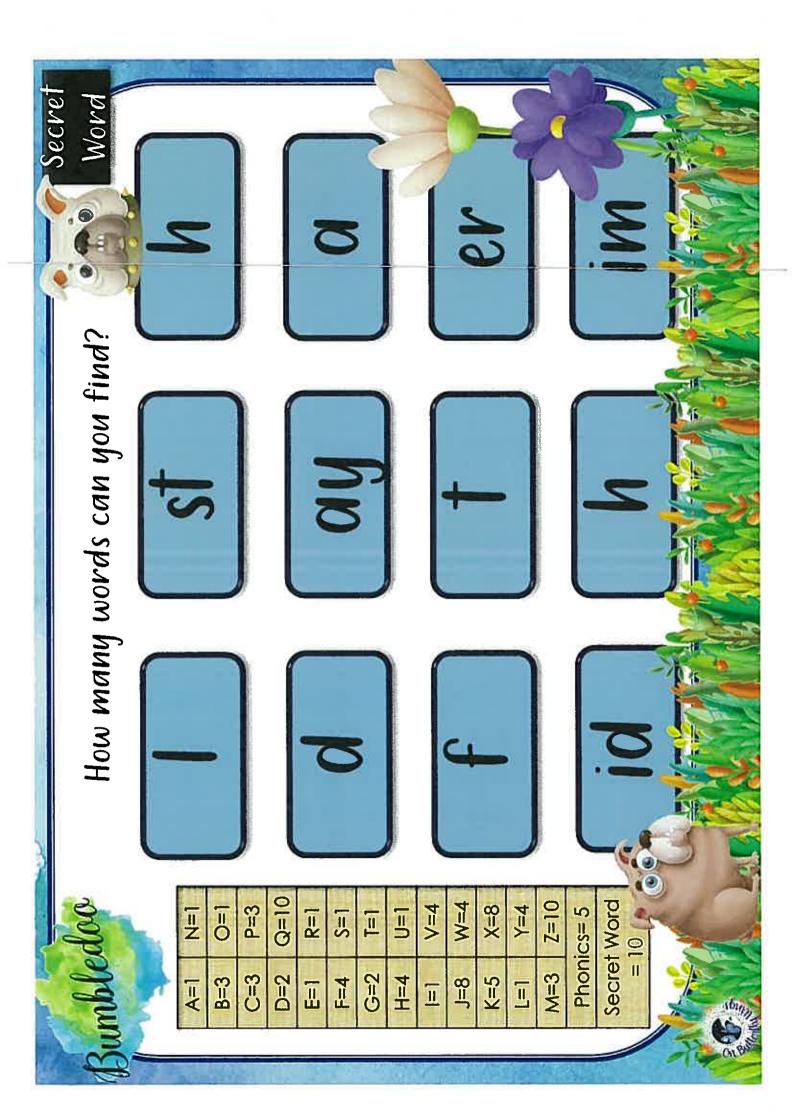

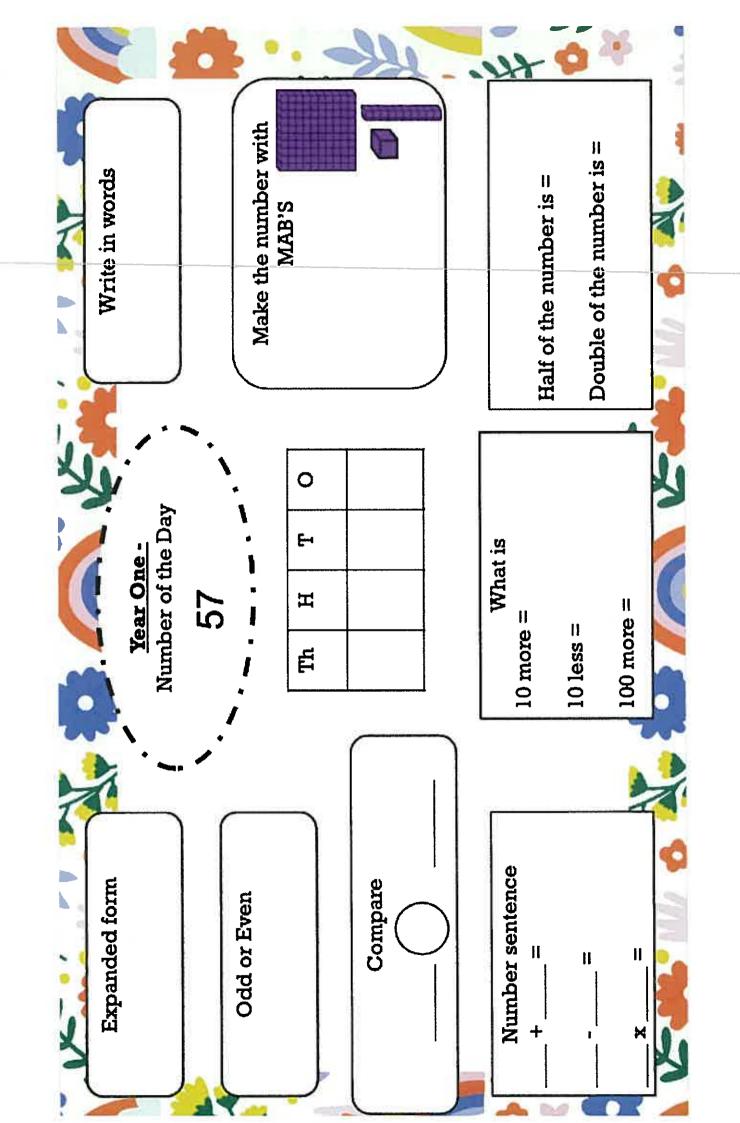

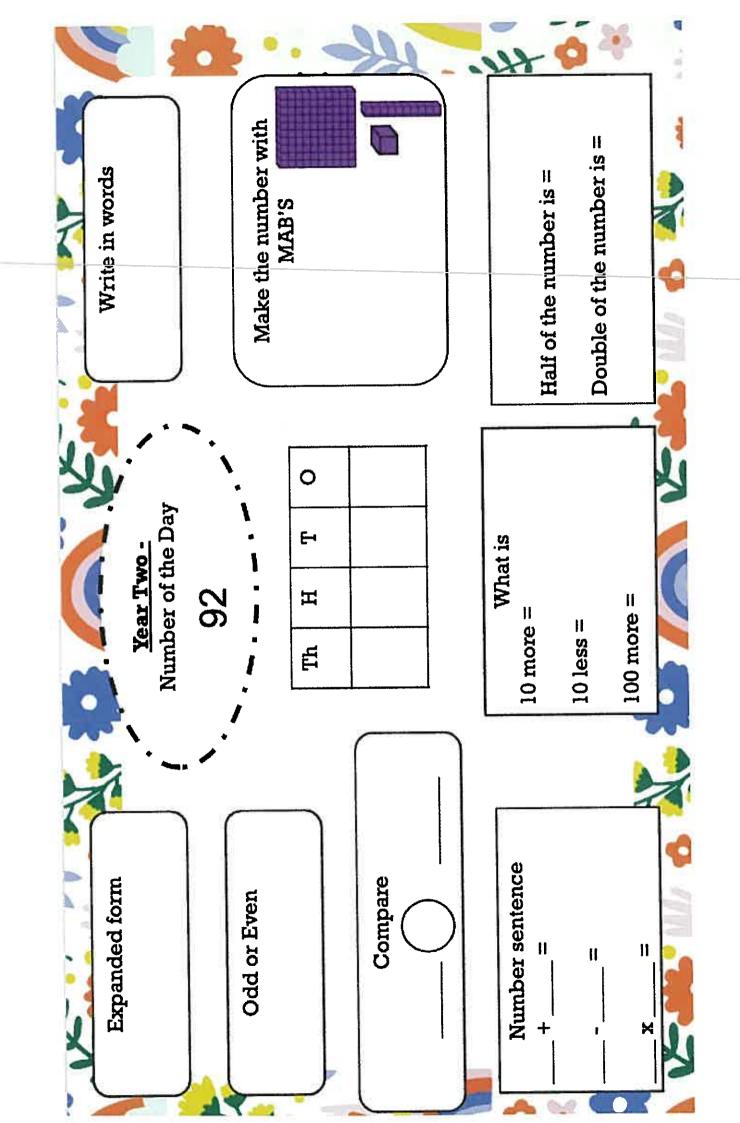

Materials:

2-4 dice

10 small counters

How to:

Each player starts with 2 dice and 5 rocks (or other counters).

The objective of the game is to capture all of the other player's rocks.

Continue playing until one player has ALL 10 rocks. On the count of three, both players roll their dice. Each player adds up the sum of his/her two dice, and whoever has a higher number gets to "steal" a rock from the other player.

Note: Encourage using strategies to add the dice quicker, eg. doubles, near doubles, friends of 10

Differentiation:

Rolling a double trumps any other number, and you get t

from Player B

Player A may 'steal' a rock

Player A has a total of 11 and Player 8 has 7.

For younger kids, you can just use one die each and focus on number identification instead of addition. For older kids, try using three!

You could practice subtraction/multiplication instead of addition skills.

To be the first player to have no cards in your hand

Materials

A deck of child friendly playing cards (or use Jack =11, etc)

How to:

- Each player is dealt 7 cards.
- Manipulate the numbers on the cards by using addition and subtraction to make ten
- When you have made ten, with two or more cards, place cards on the discard pile – saying aloud your number sentence
- If you cannot go, you pick up from the draw pile.

Example:

"2 plus 9 is equal to 11, take away 1 is 10"

"13 minus 5 is 8, plus two is equal to 10"
