K-2 assembly on Friday 5th December. All students need to be with their teachers by 4.45pm in pre-arranged clothes/costume. The concert will run for approximately 90 minutes. Please leave front area of hall for Balgownie students only. We are reserving the front row for the elderly. Seating will be tight and we expect lots of people to be standing.

Balgownie celebrates learning. We are giving four class awards for each class at Presentation Day, Monday 8th December. This is apart from the traditional whole school awards. We want to celebrate learning and this is one of the many strategies that we are using to acknowledge academic excellence, improvement, citizenship and a teacher's choice award.

Of course, with only four awards per class, it can be a difficult decision for teachers and I know they spend a long time deliberating over which students that they believe to be the most deserving. Help your child learn from this experience, to celebrate with their friends (or themselves) if they are the student awarded with a certificate, and to be gracious and resilient if they do not get an award this time. Who knows what will happen next year?

School Reports are being finalised in the next two weeks and will be given on Monday 15th December. The teachers have worked hard, both individually and in teams to ensure consistency with each other and against syllabus standards. This is another time to celebrate the learning and progress that your children have made this year. If you have any questions about your child's report, please see your class teacher.

Remember:

- Teachers plan teaching and learning programs using syllabuses developed by the Board of Studies.
- The syllabuses describe standards that apply across the state for each learning area.
- Your child's teacher uses their knowledge of syllabuses and knowledge of the children in their class to plan their teaching and learning programs.
- Teachers use their professional judgement, internal and external data gathering about each child's achievement against the statewide standards to award the grade.

 If your child has achieved a Sound on their report then he/she has achieved what is generally expected. If your child has achieved an Outstanding or High then he/she has achieved more than is generally expected. If your child has achieved a Basic or a Limited, then he or she has not yet achieved what is generally expected compared to other children of a similar age.

Effort ticks for reports are consistent across our school. When you are reading your child's report, the effort ratings for your child have been assessed using the following common understandings. Please keep this to discuss the effort ticks with your child when your reports come home.

Effort Rating for Reports

- 1. Minimal effort. Rarely completes work, even with encouragement.
- Inconsistent effort. Does some work when encouraged or work is not of standard expected of the student's ability.
- 3. Completes required tasks to student's own ability at expected level most of the time.
- 4. Completes required tasks to student's own ability to expected level all of the time. May or may not complete extra work.
- 5. Completes tasks to expected level all the time. Does extra work and shows initiative.

Well Done to Tabitha and Helena in Year 3! Following the success that Tabitha and Helena, together with three other children form KMA Wollongong showed by winning 1st place at the Under 9's showmanship at the Martial Arts World Cup held in Sydney on the 18th October this year.
