LEARNING SUPPORT 2023

Balgownie Public School is lucky to have a dedicated group of teachers this year in the Learning Support role. Teaching and learning can be adjusted in many ways, based on every student's unique needs, to enable students with disability and additional learning and support needs to enjoy the same opportunities and choices in their education as their peers. Learning support looks different in every school and changes over time. When students are identified with specific learning needs by their classroom teacher or allied health professional they may be referred to the Learning Support Team. Students may then receive tailored Learning Support which can be either in-class or small group withdrawal.

REPORTS:

On Thursday 22 June, we be hosting an information session in our school library to help parents understand the changes to our student reports.

Features of Semester 1 student reports:

- the School Bytes platform to create reports
- English and Mathematics personal comments to identify your child's strengths, improvement areas and next steps in learning
- knowledge/skill statements in all key learning areas (English, Mathematics, Science & Technology, History & Geography, Creative Art, PDHPE) with A to E achievement grading
- overall A to E achievement grading for each key learning area
- effort in each key learning area
- general comment including a teacher reflection of your child's social and academic learning and a student reflection on their learning across Semester 1

PBL focus is for the fortnight – Resilience.

- This fortnight our PBL focus is **Resilience**. At Balgownie Public School, this is how **Resilience** looks;
- In our classrooms, we know it's ok to make mistakes. We keep on trying!
- In our library, we are patient waiting for the book of our choice and look for alternatives.
- Our outdoor spaces, we understand it is only a game, if someone is unkind, we remind them of the

Holiday Update from Mrs Barton:

We have travelled along the Mekong Delta and it is beautiful. The weather is still so very, very hot. It is the start of the wet season, but we only get rain in the late afternoon, and only have rain for a short time. We have spent the last 2 weeks travelling from the Mekong Delta, through to North Vietnam. We have visited, Saigon, Hoi An and Hanoi. We also went on a boat to Halong Bay, which is a World Heritage site. Every place we have been too, is so very different.



We have seen scarf weaving and a fishing village. The children enjoy swimming in the river in the afternoon to cool down. We even rode on a rickshaw (the drivers are very strong)! Xin Chau! (Pronounced zin chow) means hello in Vietnamese! In Vietnam a school day is also half a day, morning or afternoon. We were here in time to see the last week of school for the year. So many graduation events and lots of music and celebrations. Many children will attend summer school during their summer holidays, so they can learn more. Other families will work on the farms and help with running the small business.



We have seen many old buildings and then some very, very old buildings. It is still extremely hot! 37 but felt like 47! It is very humid. People in Vietnam say they have 2 seasons, wet and dry. Or, hot and very hot! We are here in the very hot!!

There is 1 train line that goes from the top to the south of Vietnam. It is 1726 Kilometres long!

I have learned so much about Cambodian and Vietnamese culture. Every person we have met has been kind, generous and happy to share their country and culture with us. We are getting ready to fly home and I will see you all on Monday!

Parents and other carers have a key role in preventing and responding to bullying.

Learn what bullying is and what it is not. This is the first step in talking about how to prevent or respond to bullying with your child. 'Bullying' is a word that is used for lots of things that are not actually bullying. These other behaviours may be just as serious, but may require different responses.

Schools can be much more effective when parents report bullying and support their efforts to deal with it.

If your child reports that bullying is occurring at school, or the bullying involves students from the school outside of school, you should let the school know the situatio






K-6 Math Parent Workshop
