From the Principal's Desk

Empathy

Following from last fortnight, we thought it would be a great opportunity to outline how we work with students to support and encourage empathy.

Some of the ways we do this is by,

 \cdot Clearly explaining that empathy means understanding and caring about another person's feelings and taking action to help. We explain how it improves the classroom and school community.

 \cdot Explaining the importance of noticing and having empathy for people beyond immediate friends, including those who are different or who are too often invisible.

 \cdot Providing examples of how to act on empathy, such as helping, showing kindness, or even simply listening.

Having opportunities at home to have these conversations, provide our little people with a variety of circumstances that ensure they see a full range of empathy modelling.

Growth Mindset and a sweaty brain!

We are also having a strong focus on learnability and developing good, strong learning attributes. A growth mindset is a valuable tool to ensure we can become better at completing tasks or activities. At Balgownie, we refer to this as getting a 'sweaty brain'. When we work our bodies hard, they get sweaty. When we do a lot of thinking and brain work, it is only natural to imagine that our brains get sweaty as well. This is a prompt to the students to encourage them to use their thinking skills! Have you had a sweaty brain today? When we have sweaty brains, we can also practice our Grit. We keep going until we can achieve something, learn something, or improve something. Those with a growth mindset will find setbacks motivating. They see mistakes as informative or an opportunity to have another go! Michael Jordan, the basketball player, had an incredible growth mindset. He was dropped from his high school team, and instead of giving up, he practiced harder and developed his skills.

Thank you to those families who have met with their children and class teachers to discuss the learning goals for 2024. If you are yet to arrange a time to meet with the teacher and your child, please contact the school office to make a mutually convenient time.

You probably know about Return & Earn? What you may not know is that you can contribute Return & Earn money to Balgownie Public School!

Return & Earn works for those small single serve plastic bottles (eg. gatorade), cans or glass bottles. Milk cartons or big juice cartons etc are not accepted, you can recycle them in your yellow bin at home.

Where is Return & Earn located?

The automatic deposit machine is located near Corrimal Library.

When you get to the Return & Earn collection point, simply scan the barcode below and start feeding your bottles down the chute. This money is then sent to the P & C's PayPal account which will help us raise money throughout the year. Every little bit helps, and your children are always the recipients of material bought with the money raised for the school.

Of course, recycling in any way is better than it going to landfill, so you can involve your children in Return & Earn where they can earn some pocket money, or you can choose to donate it to one of the charities or organisations listed.
